The Toronto Birth Centre (TBC) aims to build a space where people, families and communities can access culturally safe birthing care. The TBC's Community Council is currently recruiting interested individuals for nomination as the TBC Board of Directors' Knowledge Keeper and aims to nominate a member who can best accomplish the objectives of the TBC, in alignment with its vision, core values, and Indigenous framework.

The Board of Directors has the ultimate decision-making and authority for all responsibilities outlined in the Independent Health Facilities Act license agreement, including all matters relating to finances, strategic planning, quality assurance and compliance for the TBC. The Board's membership is two-thirds registered midwives and majority self-identified Indigenous people. The Board is accountable to its clients, the communities the TBC serves, government agencies, institutional partners and community stakeholders.
