
# Message from the Executive Director

This year has been a phenomenal year for the birth centre. We have exceeded our funded numbers for the year again once again. This year has brought many opportunities to engage midwives in looking at our data and extrapolating some of our successes over the long-term such as : many of the key outcomes for the Toronto Birth Centre are consistent with those of Ontario midwifery home birth clients and thus we can be confident in both the safety and outcomes at TBC. We also had many opportunities to explore areas of access and inclusion for those people with disabilities and made several improvements on our birth spaces. Groups in the community have come forward to build partnerships with TBC such as with OCAMA through offering free space and hosting a session with them on lactation/breast/chestfeeding session for Black and queer folks. We have also been able to offer cultural activities such as hide preparation in conjunction with Titiesg Wîcinímintôwak (Bluejays Dancing Together), an arts collective by and for Two-Spirit artists and a family medicine walk by the Humber River hosted by Ojibiikaan. We have been very fortunate to have such a dedicated group of people committed to working with the birth centre. Near the end of the fiscal year, the pandemic hit Toronto and we continued to offer birthing services but had to put classroom rentals and groups on hold and find another way to host programming on-line. By far, the most incredible highlight of this year was the credentialing at TBC of our first Aboriginal Midwife working under the exception clause of the Midwifery Act. This has been a dream and vision of the organization since opening. We hope that in the years to come, Indigenous people are inspired to learn about and engage in all forms of birth work in communities everywhere.




#### TRANSPORTS\* January 30, 2014-March 31,2020

- 30.3% of people admitted to TBC experienced transport to a hospital. This is in line with the Association of Ontario Midwives' statistics for transports from home births.
- 75.1% of all transports were nonurgent transports to hospital by private vehicle.
- 5.9% of transports were to St. Michael's Hospital by midwives without hospital privileges.
- <1% of transports went to Sick Kids Hospital.

\*On occasion, parent and newborn may both require transport. This may be in same or separate vehicles.

## Access & Equity

The Toronto Birth Centre has set a mandate to prioritize access for communities that experience barriers to adequate health care. Clients can choose to self-identify as members of one or more Prioritized Communities.





## Education at TBC

- The TBC has contracts with 3 Midwifery Education Programs (MEPs): Laurentian, McMaster, and Ryerson Universities.
- TBC also offered inter-professional placements from Sept-April for Ryerson's Nursing, Nutrition and Social Work programs.
- U of T Medical students participated in TBC placement Sept to March.
- TBC entered into a one-time agreement to offer a placement for a Global Health Student from York University.

## Education at TBC

- 33% of all admissions involved students
  - 161 (27.8%) admissions were attended by 1 student
  - 30 (5.2%) admissions were attended by 2+ students
- 173 admissions included MPG students
- 17 admissions included students placed at TBC
- 19 admissions included students identified as Indigenous
- 3 admissions included non-midwifery students








## **Financial Position**
