## Message from the President and CEO

The publication of this latest report marks the end of our eight full year of service to the birthing community. It has been a tough year weighing on everyone-midwives have stepped up to help in the healthcare system response to the pandemic and have continued to support births in and out of hospital and our clients have continued to want to deliver their babies in community. We have been blessed with a stable and healthy workforce and our frontline staff have been Ogichidaa/kwe (warriors) throughout the pandemic showing up everyday to ensure that our clients and families continue to have access to a culturally safe space to give birth.

This year we continued to use technology to offer virtual sessions to meet people's needs including online tours . We reintroduced our site as a public location for infant hearing clinics after the big surges in Covid-19 counts declined and had made a commitment to support the expanding range of healthcare professionals associated with the Call Aunty clinics and Baby Bundle program operating out of the TBC.


Coupled with the trend of a declining birth rate in Canada, our numbers this year have seen a decrease as families have chosen to delay their family planning during this period of instability and as Ontario allowed the hospital system to respond and provide better temporary response to support birthing families that are uninsured.

The emergence of COVID-19 and its variants had provided us all with time to reflect on our priorities and deepest desires. The Directors of TBC and its staff have also done this work and we look forward to providing more amazing service next year, grounded always to this land, our core values wrapped within an Indigenous framework; and, with a solid commitment to serve people whose continued ability to access our programs and birthing service is valued and precious to everyone.





Respiratory distress



- 30.5% of people admitted to TBC experienced transport to a hospital. This in line with the Association of **Ontario Midwives statistics for** transports from home births.
- 75.2% of all transports were nonurgent transports to hospital by private vehicle
- 5.8% of transports went to St. Michael's Hospital by midwives without hospital privileges
- 1% of transports went to Sick Kids Hospital

**TBC is** providing a space and context where midwives are achieving low Caesarean section rates for clients, comparable to C/S rates for planned home births.

## Education

Student placement activities continued, on-site and virtually, throughout the fiscal year. TBC supports the growth of health human resources in midwifery and allied health and social professions. TBC offered one placement for a Ryerson Social Work student who completed their placement remotely. The TBC had contracts with 2 Midwifery Education Programs (MEPs): McMaster, and Toronto Metropolitan Universities.

University of Toronto Medical students participated in TBC placement Sept to May.




