## Description

The midwifery-led postpartum clinic will provide up to six weeks of postpartum and newborn care for obstetrical patients of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and the Department of Family and Community Medicine with an emphasis on families who do not have access to primary care or who require additional supports in the post-partum period. The midwife will support birthing parent and infant dyads who have delivered at Unity Health, St. Michael's Hospital and need care in the first 6 weeks after discharge by providing the following services:

- Assessment and treatment of post-delivery maternal complications such as bleeding or wound care needs
- Head to toe newborn assessments including weight checks and assessing for jaundice
- Supporting infant feeding including breast/chest feeding
- Parental mental health assessments and developing relevant care plans including making referrals to care providers
- Consulting with Obstetricians and Pediatricians when needed
- Providing patient teaching
- Connecting families to relevant community services, including ongoing primary care providers
- Doing home and community visits, including to shelters and hotels.
- Providing virtual on call advice and care for families at home post discharge.
