The Toronto Birth Centre (TBC) aims to build a space where pregnant people, families and communities can access *culturally safe birthing care*. TBC is seeking a new member for the Quality Advisory Committee (**QAC**), who can participate in alignment with TBC's vision, core values, and Indigenous framework.



The QAC monitors and evaluates services at the TBC, recommends areas for quality improvement, and reports on those activities to the Board.

The successful candidate will be:

- A person with expertise in midwifery, obstetrics and/or pediatrics
- Available to attend meetings quarterly (or more frequently as called by the Chair)
- Available to commit to a term of 3 years, with possibility for re-appointment
- Able to take on the responsibilities to:
 - o review committee documents
 - participate in verifying minutes of meetings
 - meet agreed-upon timelines
 - attend public events (when required), as outlined in the QAC Terms of Reference (available on the TBC website: <u>www.torontobirthcentre.ca</u>).

Participation on the QAC is an exciting opportunity to be a part of our ongoing work!

Selecting and recommending a potential QAC member for this position is the task of the TBC's *Midwives' Council*. They will review applications to make their recommendation to the TBC's Board.

Self-identified Indigenous people and those who have a strong track record of ally work with Indigenous communities are encouraged to come forward. People with skills and expertise in quality improvement, patient safety, and program evaluation are especially encouraged to apply.
